#### **Outset Update**

Setting the benchmark: £3.36 value for every £1 invested in Outset

Outset, the award-winning start-up support service in Bournemouth, delivers a return of £3.36 of social, economic and financial value for every £1 invested, according to a recent independent evaluation by NEF Consulting, leading experts in the field of impact assessment. That's more than £38.5 million of value created across the South West since 2009.

For the last eighteen months, the non-for-profit Outset service has been delivered throughout Bournemouth, thanks to funding from the European Regional Development Fund, Bournemouth Borough Council, J.P. Morgan and Bournemouth 2026. In that time, Outset has engaged with over **1000** local residents, and supported the creation of over **95** businesses and **130** new jobs in the area, though the total value Outset brings to the local community is much greater than that.



## **Bournemouth Young Volunteer Award**

The Bournemouth Young Volunteer Award continues to be a great success. They now have 3 young people who have been awarded their 500 hour certificate and trophy.

As part of their ongoing effort to provide training opportunities for volunteers, four young volunteer training events have been scheduled for July and August:
