Concordat between the Trust and Council is Ratified

Bournemouth 2026 Trust acquired charitable status in 2012 after having formerly been a partnership housed within Bournemouth Borough Council. Upon becoming a Community Land and Development Trust, it moved out of the Town Hall offices and is now an independent organisation.

The Trust works closely in partnership with the Council and this relationship has been outlined in the Concordat which has now been agreed. A Concordat is an agreement between two organisations outlining their relationship with each other. How both organisations will work collaboratively from now and into the future is a key element of this document.
