Department for Communities & Local Government Update

News on whether the LGR (Local Government Reorganisation) is to happen across Dorset is expected to come from DCLG this month. The Rt Hon. Sajid Javid MP has had this on his agenda for a while and his decision is eagerly awaited. The proposal being examined is whether Dorset becomes two unitary authorities; one to include Bournemouth, Poole and Christchurch and another to encompass East Dorset District Council, North Dorset District Council, Purbeck District Council, West Dorset District Council and Weymouth & Portland Borough Council.

Bournemouth Remembers

On 12th November the town's Remembrance Day Service will take place by the War Memorial in the Central Gardens. The service starts at 10.57am and is followed by a two minutes' silence at 11am. The service lasts for around 40 minutes and concludes with a Wreath Laying Ceremony.

HM Lord-Lieutenant of Dorset (or their representative) and The Mayor will lay the first wreaths followed by Military and civilian organisations and finally the Ex-Service Wreath Layers lay their wreaths together.

If you would like to attend this Service, you can watch it in Bourne Avenue, an area of the Central Gardens or in Avenue Road. Areas in Bourne Avenue and the Gardens are reserved for wheelchair users.

Orders of Service are distributed so everyone can take part in the Service.

Bonfire night treat meets classic comfort food in this doubly delicious dessert that your family won't be able to resist

3 red dessert apples
juice of half lemon
4tbsp golden caster sugar
397g can caramel (Carnation)
6 brioche finger rolls sliced into rounds
3 eggs
400ml full-fat milk
200ml double cream
1tsp vanilla extract
ice-cream/custard to serve (optional)

1. Core apples & slice into rings about thickness of a 50p coin. Toss through lemon juice and 2 tbsp sugar. Spread two thirds of caramel over the base of a large baking dish (20cm x 30cm)
2. Layer the brioche and apple rings in the dish in overlapping lines. Dot spoonfuls of left-over caramel here and there, leaving bits of apple poking out. In a jug whisk together the milk, cream eggs, vanilla and 1tbsp sugar. Pour mixture over brioche and apples, making sure it's all well covered, then wrap in cling film and set aside for at least 30 mins or even overnight in the fridge.
3. Heat oven to 170C/150C fan/Gas 3. Uncover the pudding and scatter with remaining 1tbsp sugar. Bake for 45-50 mins until the top is golden and the custard has set. The caramel should be bubbling around the edges and the pudding puffed up. Serve with vanilla ice cream or custard, if desired!
